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## SATA Drivers Create Installation CDs for Windows XP

Windows XP Pro SP2 W SATA Integrated Drivers! I have to call off the week for a little while due to health issues and will be unable to post on the forum until next week. We have a Windows XP Home Edition SP2 CD with SATA drivers that would be available for download if any other XP Home Edition SP2 users needed them. Since the Windows XP Pro drivers will not be integrated I am going to wait for SP3 to be released and add them manually to the ISO. After release of SP3 I will post the details of how to integrate SATA drivers. I am guessing that this will be a two part response, and that the first post will include the Windows XP Home Edition SP2 CD with SATA drivers that I mentioned above. Before I begin, let me thank everyone in the forum for the time and advice they have given me over the years. I have an old PC that used to run a Windows NT 3.1 installation. Now I want to install Windows XP Pro SP2. I was wondering, is it possible for XP Pro SP2 to be setup with SATA drivers integrated? If so, will this result in a completely different installation CD as there will be different CD content from NT 3.1 installation CD? I will explain the problem as best as I can. I would like to install the latest Windows XP Pro SP2 on my PC. My PC came with integrated SATA drivers on the installation CD. The motherboard that my PC came with does not have an integrated SATA port. The motherboard has a CD ROM drive which comes with SATA drivers. So I have got the SATA driver CD that comes with the motherboard. At installation, I have got an error saying ". This is very strange because the SATA drivers from the motherboard are already installed on my hard disk. What I have done is that I have disassembled the hard disk and installed the SATA drivers on an empty disk. Then I have installed the SATA drivers from the motherboard CD on this disk. To be honest, I do not understand what I am doing wrong. When I go to the XP installation and select the Disk (LBA) option, it says ". I have no problem with the NT 3.1 installation as I am new to the PC. I was wondering what might be the problem with the XP setup? Is there a configuration that I am missing? Do I need to change a setting on the BIOS? Since the SATA drivers are already installed

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
